### IMPORTANT DATES

#### May 14-16

## SUMMER CAMP

Summer Camp – This year we will be attending an exciting camp, Camp Horseshoe, for the first time. The camp is located on the Pennsylvania-Maryland border. Cost per scout is \$230. This year's camp runs from Sunday to Sunday. The cost for adults attending for the full week is \$115.

All scouts (other than first year scouts) must be prepared to discuss with the scoutmasters the merit badges that they plan to work on at camp at the troop meeting on June 1. The list of merit badges available and the schedule are in the Parents' Guide previously provided. Leaders will be available to work with the scouts at all of our meetings prior to June 1.

Scouts need completed Class I and II medicals to attend summer camp. The Class I section is completed on an annual basis by a parent. The Class II medical is completed by your doctor and is good for three years. If you are relying on last year's Class II, please contact Tom McCabe to make sure we have a copy on file.

Adults over 40 years old need to have a Class III medical which is good for one year. Scouts attending Philmont may use their Class III medical form although it is only good for one year. **Everyone attending summer camp must have a medical form completed and submitted to the troop by June 15.**
